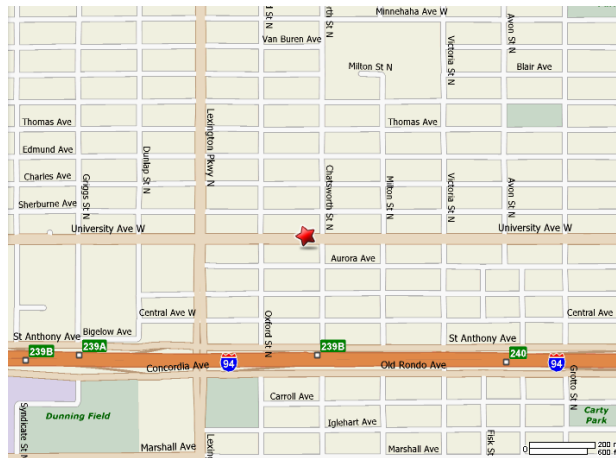

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION AND LITERACY PROGRAMS

The program is open to everyone over the age of 18. Its goal is to promote personal development, self-sufficiency, and reduce dependency in Hmong adults by effectively preparing them for their new employment and life in America.

The program is divided into two parts: the citizenship classes and the ESL classes.

CITIZENSHIP CLASS

The classes prepare students for their citizenship exam by teaching them about American history, government, legal system, and other principles. The program also offers tutoring sessions for the citizenship interviews and for writing.

ESL CLASS (ENGLISH AS SECOND LANGUAGE)

The classes train adults in basic English vocabulary and grammar, and more importantly inter-personal communicational skills to prepare them for the everyday life and the American working environment.

Through the classes, students will also gain a better understanding of and experience for the employment-seeking process including, applications, advertisements, and interviews.

Furthermore, lab sessions will allow students to develop and be familiar with basic computer, internet skills and programs such as Microsoft Word, and Rosetta Stone.
